About This Pattern

The knitted Halloween treat bags are easy and quick to make, with a simple stocking stitch design. Great for using leftover yarns in your stash, make a few to gift to friends and family with some treats inside!

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Yarn

- We Are Knitters / The Petite Wool in the following colors:
- Scraps of Ochre (around 10-15g)
- Scraps of Cinnamon (around 10-15g)
- Scraps of Natural (around 10-15g)
- The yarn weight is bulky/chunky/12 ply.

Needles

• 6mm (US 10) knitting needles

Notions

- Scissors
- Darning needle
- Tape measure

Other Materials

• String or ribbon to tie at the top of the bags (see photos for reference)

Gauge

• 14 sts/20 rows in 4x4 inches/10x10cm in stocking stitch.

Size

Laying flat and not yet seamed...

- Large = Length 15 inches / Width 5 inches
- Small = Length 9 inches / Width 5 inches

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Abbreviations

- CO Cast on
- K Knit
- P Purl
- Rep Repeat
- RS Right side
- St(s) Stitch(es)
- St St Stocking stitch (RS row Knit, WS row Purl)
- WS Wrong side

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Pattern

Yarn A - Natural

Yarn B - Cinnamon

Yarn C - Ochre

Large Bag

In Yarn A cast on 20 sts.

- Work in st st for 3 inches.
- Change to Yarn B (RS row) cont to work in st st for 3 inches.
- Change to Yarn C (RS row) cont to work in st st for 3 inches.
- Change to Yarn B (RS row) cont to work in st st for 3 inches.
- Change to Yarn A (RS row) cont to work in st st for 3 inches.

Cast off, leaving a long length for seaming (around 16 inches).

Small Bag

In Yarn A cast on 20 sts.

- Work in st st for 1.5 inches.
- Change to Yarn B (RS row) cont to work in st st for 1.5 inches.
- Change to Yarn C (RS row) cont to work in st st for 3 inches.
- Change to Yarn B (RS row) cont to work in st st for 1.5 inches.
- Change to Yarn A (RS row) cont to work in st st for 1.5 inches.

Cast off, leaving a long length for seaming (around 14 inches).

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Making Up

The making-up instructions apply to both bags.

- Weave in any loose ends (weaving up the sides where possible).
- Fold the bag in half with the right sides facing you and match up the color strips.
- Seam one side first and then the other using the matres stitch.

- Secure and weave in any loose ends.
- Your bag is now ready to use!
- Place treats inside (still in their wrappers) and tie the top of the bag with a piece of twine or ribbon.

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
